

Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council
Summary of Council's Work Program
FY 2021-2022

- Implement the 3rd year of the Three-Year grant for Council's Brownfields Assessment Grant Program in cooperation with the South Florida Regional Planning Council, continue operation of the Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund Program, and prepare next Assessment Grant application.
- Implement the Council's Regional Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy Plan.
- Participate in a Regional Coalition and Advocacy for Protection and Restoration of SE Florida's Nearshore Reef Systems.
- Continue to implement the new Three-Year Economic Development Administration Planning Grant to continue Council's long running Economic Development programs that make local governments stronger and more entrepreneurial.
- Implement the 2nd year of the Two-Year Economic Development Administration COVID-19 supplemental grant, including a dedicated Disaster Economic Recovery Coordinator.
- Continue Council's Local Comprehensive Plan Review and Technical Assistance Program.
- Continue Council's long-standing Emergency Preparedness Programs: First Responder Training, Hazardous Materials and Waste Planning and Site Registration, Local Emergency Planning Committee, Small Quantity Generators, and Emergency Preparedness Planning and Exercises.
- Share the recently completed Statewide Regional Evacuation Study performed by all ten regional planning councils and funded by the Florida Division of Emergency Management.
- Strengthen Council's Community Visioning and Redevelopment Program:
 - FEC Railway Quiet Zone Designation Assistance for Local Governments in northern Palm Beach County.
 - Riviera Beach CRA Plan Update and associated Water Quality, Signage, Ocean Mall, and Multi-modal Transportation components.
 - Delray Beach CRA Plan Update.
 - Economic Analysis and Development Planning for State Road 7 and the Mall at Wellington Green in the Village of Wellington.
 - Redevelopment Planning for State Road 7 in Royal Palm Beach.
 - Continuing Services for Martin County CRA.
 - Agreement between Fort Pierce and FPUA for Sewer Pant Relocation.
 - Stuart Form Based Code.

- Community Vision for Lake Worth Beach CRA Properties.
- Corridor Plan for Port St. Lucie Boulevard.
- Tequesta Commercial Area Plans.
- Expand and Strengthen Council’s Working Relationship with South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), and Palm Beach Transportation Planning Agency (PBTPA).
 - 2nd Year of latest Three-year Technical Assistance Agreement with PBTPA
 - 2nd Year of latest Five-year Technical Assistance Agreement with SFRTA
 - 1st Year of new Planning Assistance Agreement with FDOT District 4
- Continue to be an Outlet for Information, Education, and Regional Advocacy for Implementing the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan.
- Build on the results of the Biosolids Summit for the Treasure Coast Region held on June 8, 2018 in partnership with the Indian River Lagoon Council, Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Florida Farm Bureau Federation, and local government utility and solid waste authorities.
- Continue exploration of the US Highway 27 Multimodal Corridor concept.
- Continue the Education Program emphasizing Traditional Town Planning and Preferred Development Patterns.
- Facilitate Port St. Lucie Development Review Stakeholder Meetings.
- Provide technical assistance for local governments in the Region concerning the 2020 Census.
- Complete the study of potential lane re-purposing on US 1 in North Palm Beach.
- Assist with implementation of the Multi-Modal Circulation Plan for the Indian Trail Improvement District.
- Organize and conduct a virtual joint workshop on November 5, 2021 between the Treasure Coast and South Florida Regional Planning Councils and reach consensus on critical issues affecting Southeast Florida. The workshop in 2021 produced the following (adopted separately by each council).
